**Meeting Minutes**

Hyundai Grant Committee – 5:00 (Larry Crandall, Alaina Knight-Hougen, Barbara Montz, Mayor Ted Bui, Jynene Johnson, Susan Castellanos, and Jane Iovine).

Fountain Valley High School Track and Field – Presentation asking for equipment assistance to replace Pole Vaulting from 2008. The amount asked for is \$8,247.60. The funds would assist in safety for the students. The requested donation to join track and field is a requested \$150 per student. Currently they have 244 athletes. If this grant is not granted, the board will be looking at fundraisers with restaurants, and looking for help. This is a dire need for the students and for seasons to come. Matt Roque presented along with a coach from the team. They advised last year the girls' record was broken and the student got a scholarship to Oregon State. This year the boys are looking to have the record broken at 15'8". This may be done by a Junior this year.

The board is looking at granting \$2,000.00 - however, will have Glenn and Larry talk to them about matching during the Poker tournament.

PRESENTATIONS (5 Minutes Each) -

Sir Daniel Winn presented on behalf of the Academy of Fine Art Foundation Collection. He would like to leave his legacy for Fountain Valley in the form of an Art Gallery. He showed pieces that he would like to hold onto until Fountain Valley has a place for this area collection worth millions. These are currently being housed in Anaheim. He and his late mother started in Fountain Valley and then went to Laguna Beach and then Rodeo Drive and all over the world. The Foundation would renovate with his experience and expertise to add ART to Fountain Valley. Sir Daniel Winn would generate revenue through his contacts to bring awareness to Fountain Valley. This space that would be chosen would benefit the city, the culture, the generations and so much more. This space would provide for education, worldwide recognition, fundraising opportunities, and meeting space. The location could be where Boys and Girls Club is vacating by the Civic Center. The expense for the foundation would be running security cameras, insurance, electrical maintenance as well as Administration Team and Director. Volunteers would be Docents and hence no payment. The museum itself would generate income through donations, admission entrance, event space payments, gift shop, and possibly Art Auctions. If the need was to have other artists portray their Art - the artists would pay a fee for their showings - however, there would be a jury to select the art from these visiting artists.

HIGHLIGHTS

Balance Sheet

- Cash is \$357,921
- Unrestricted Fund Balance is now at \$123,665. \$78,418 is available for Foundation use.
- Restricted Funds is \$223,569. Individual fund balances reflect funds still available for their stated purpose.
- The Spring Poker Tournament has a fund balance of \$2,739. This is made up of \$2,750 in sponsorships and \$900 in registrations minus any expenses incurred to date.

Income Statement

- Unrestricted Corporate Contributions decreased from prior month by \$1,500 due to a receipt that was determined to belong to Operation Santa Claus and was reclassified in March
- Other Program Revenue reflects Car Show income which was accrued at \$2,000 for the prior fiscal year. These proceeds were not achieved so the accrual was reversed and therefore showing a \$2,000 credit.
- Interest income for the current month is \$2,527 and \$12,909 year-to-date.
- The \$2,881 Released from Restriction is the proceeds of \$850 from the Great FV Campout and \$2,031 from Hall of Fame which represent closed events whose net proceeds have been transferred from its restricted purpose to the unrestricted fund.
- Total Awards and Grants issued for the year-to-date is \$88,770
- Awards and Grants Unrestricted includes the following payments for grants and other community support in February and March:

Net Increase/(Decrease) Year-to-Date

- The Foundation Unrestricted Fund decreased by \$4,165. Note that third quarter revenues will include Summerfest MOU and Bar Fees, Spring Poker proceeds and interest earnings. However, annual sponsorship of City events of \$10,600 and \$4,000 sponsorship of Summerfest Community Stage are yet to be incurred.
- Restricted Funds decreased by \$44,659. The Hyundai annual pledge of \$100,000 is recorded in April and will offset this decrease next month.

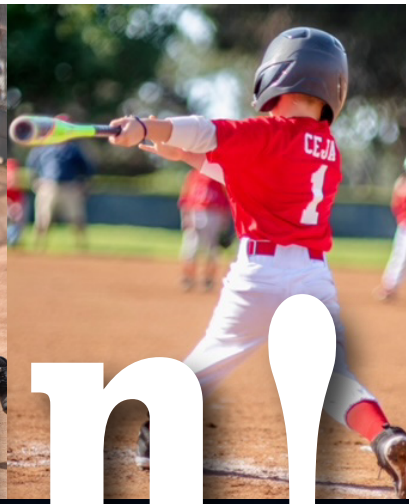

G.R.A.C.E. Social and Medical Service offers services to Middle Eastern and North African immigrants to help them adjust to their new lives in the US. They distribute food at their headquarters in Fountain Valley and two apartment complexes in Orange and Santa Ana.

## Fountain Valley Community Foundation General Fund

### Description of the program or service for which the grant is being requested

Second Harvest Food Bank, SHFB, respectfully requests \$10,968 to fund the Grocery Rescue program for FY26 (July 2025 – June 2026) at two of our Fountain Valley partners: Vital Access Care Foundation and G.R.A.C.E. Social and Medical Service.

SHFB's Grocery Rescue, GR, program diverts millions of pounds of good, nutritious food donated by grocery/retail stores to food insecure people in Orange County, rather than going to landfills as food waste.

Grocery stores, markets, and other retail locations that sell food pull items they no longer have room for or want on their shelves and set it aside to donate to SHFB. Often, this food has weeks left before "sell by" or "best by" dates, so it is food that is perfectly good, nutritious, safe, and could still be sold, but the store just doesn't need it anymore. This food is then picked up by community organizations that distribute food as part of SHFB's Partner Network. SHFB coordinates between 280+ grocery/retail locations and 76 Partner Network organizations to schedule 900+ pickups of donated food each week. Donated food is taken back to the organization, processed and weighed, and reported back to SHFB so we can track the pounds and types of food received. This food is then distributed by the community organization. This direct pick-up model gets food from stores and into the community in only a few days.

Every pound of food picked up and distributed through the Grocery Rescue program is a pound of food not sent to a landfill, reducing food waste by millions of pounds each year while also helping meet the growing need for food in Orange County.

Because Grocery Rescue food is donated, the cost of the program lies almost exclusively in our staff who facilitate hundreds of food donation pickups each week. This makes the Grocery Rescue food an incredible value, averaging about 0.03 cents per pound of rescued food. Being able to source this amount and variety of fresh, healthy foods for pennies per pound helps us maximize our budget and make strategic purchases to supplement donated food and ensure we're providing well-rounded and balanced food options to the families we serve.

This request is specifically to support the Grocery Rescue program at two Fountain Valley sites:

- Partner since December 2021
- 2,554 - Average served a month in FY24

Operating our GR program requires a tremendous amount of work with four full-time staff across our Sourcing Department and our Programs & Services Department, who are essential to its success. Our Sourcing Department is responsible for all retail partner aspects of the program while the Programs & Services Department is responsible for all community partner aspects. Two full-time Coordinators from each department collaborate to scout for additional partners, onboard new partners, train staff and volunteers, conduct site visits, oversee reporting, ensure food safety, and troubleshooting issues as they arise for more than 900+ pickups each week.

Foundation funding would go toward these staffing costs, enabling us to maintain our relationships with stores and partners currently part of Grocery Rescue, expand the program to more partners to increase our impact, and improve training, onboarding, and reporting to ensure the program is run efficiently.

### **Scope of the targeted population**

While Orange County is viewed as a wealthy area, there are hundreds of thousands of our neighbors in need – facing food and/or nutritional insecurity hidden in plain sight – and the need is growing. In fact, the County is facing a hidden hunger crisis and the number of people we serve continues to climb. In FY24 (July 2023-June 2024) Second Harvest served a monthly average of 442,154 people (duplicated) – that's 12.6% higher than the average we served in FY23. In October 2024, we served 529,422 people (duplicated), the largest monthly number served we've seen in 3 ½ years and more than double our pre-COVID average of 249,000.

We serve anyone in OC who needs food, for as long as they need it. We specifically target our food distribution partnerships to areas in OC with overlapping indicators of food and/or nutritional security: lower income, higher food assistance enrollment, less access to affordable and healthy food, communities of color, higher rates of free and reduced-price meal program eligibility at schools. With these indicators, we estimate that 95% of the people we serve are low- to moderate-income.

G.R.A.C.E. Social and Medical Service provides transitional services to new immigrants in Southern California from the Middle East and North Africa community. This includes providing basic needs such as housing, healthcare, transportation, and food so families can acclimate and thrive in their new lives in the US. G.R.A.C.E. distributes food at 4 locations: their headquarters in Fountain Valley, as well as two apartment complexes in Orange and one in Santa Ana.

Vital Access Care Foundation was originally known as Vietnamese American Cancer Foundation and as the name says, the organization primarily focused on the Vietnamese community, particularly those that are going through cancer treatment. Their rename was to serve a broad base beyond the Vietnamese community, and support people going through cancer treatment and Fountain Valley residents in general. In addition to the food distribution, VACF offers case management support to address the various needs of the individuals and families they serve.

### **Expected results**

We are currently budgeting for FY26, and do not have FY26 goals yet, but we expect those to be similar to our current, FY25 goals for GR:

- Source 20,500,000 pounds of food
- Assess pick up capacity for current Grocery Rescue community partners
- Programs & Services team will:
  - Recruit at least 7 community partners to add Grocery Rescue to their program
  - Complete 2 compliance visits per year to each partner (150 total)



- Conduct quarterly GR partner feedback collection about challenges, successes, and opportunities to take on more pickups
- Sourcing team will:
  - Add 6 ethnically diverse grocery stores to the donation program
  - Add 8 pickups to existing retail partner's schedule
  - Visit each donating grocery/retail store 4 times a year
  - Recognize our 10 top grocery rescue donors with appreciation visits on February 21 and send every store a certificate and thank you letter

Second Harvest uses Ceres inventory database software and client reporting data from agencies to gauge the performance of each program. Ceres enables us to track every pound of food received and distributed and through which program or activity the transaction took place. Second Harvest uses this data to run reports to obtain poundage based on the desired parameters (certain sites, certain timeframes, etc.)

Each community partner that participates in Grocery Rescue is responsible for sorting and weighing the food it collects at every pickup and reporting those pounds to the food bank. We use that information to report on how much food each grocery/retail store donates, how much each community partner site is picking up and what kinds of foods.

Each community partner also has dedicated staff or volunteers who track the number of people they serve through food distributions. That data is reported back to Second Harvest Food Bank to be compiled so reports can be run that detail relevant information regarding the number of people served.

Using pounds of food distributed and people served we can track the impact of the Grocery Rescue program over time and measure its success.

#### **Potential benefit to the community**

The Grocery Rescue program delivers hundreds of thousands of pounds of food to people in Fountain Valley facing food and nutritional insecurity. For those people, Grocery Rescue means they don't have to worry about how they will afford groceries for the week, or about if they'll be able to feed their children after school, or how they'll make ends meet on a fixed income.

In FY24, the two Fountain Valley Grocery Rescue sites distributed 415,107 pounds of food and so far in FY25, they have distributed 241,381 pounds of food. That's not only food provided to our neighbors in need, it's food not unnecessarily sent to landfills as waste, when it is still fresh and nutritious.

An unexpected bonus of GR is the wide variety of food donated through the program, providing the people we serve with items SHFB wouldn't typically purchase or have donated through other channels. This diversity of food items provides new items to try and items that are priced out of reach for many, especially households with low-income or fixed food budgets.

#### **Long-term sustainability of the project**

Grocery Rescue is a long-term program of Second Harvest Food Bank that we have been operating since 2008. In FY24, Grocery Rescue accounted for 41.2% of all the food we distributed, so it is a significant, vital part of our food sourcing efforts. It is part of our budgetary and programmatic planning for the foreseeable future, including 4 full time staff just to run this program. We have a robust fundraising plan that includes individuals, corporations, and foundations who align with our mission. This includes specifically soliciting donors to fund Grocery Rescue.
