Briefly bullet point your key Programs and Services.

I have been teaching STEAM science at Talbert Middle School in FVSD for over 10 years. This is a application based class. Students are chose based on their application and teacher recommendation. This year I have 3 STEAM classes (1 7th grade and 2 8th grade). 84 students total.

Briefly state what makes your Program unique.

The goal of the STEAM program is promote Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math into my curriculum. Students receive more project based assignments, create more videos/arts based projects, and participates in various field trips. My students are currently starting on a six month project called the Invention Convention. They are tasked with inventing something new. They must research similar inventions, marketing of products and ultimately they will engineer a prototype. Students wil then present their inventions to the staff and 10 will be chosen to compete in the Southern California Invention Convention.

Briefly describe the Organization's Key Initiatives, Accomplishments and/or Challenges over the Past Two Years.

Key accomplishments are:

1. Over 80 applicants for this years STEAM Program.
2. Over the last 10 years, there has been a huge increase in STEAM participants.
3. 2024 & 2025: 3 students were named National Finalists for the Invention Convention (they travel to Michigan for the finals).

Briefly describe the Project for which funding is sought.

Every year I try to find field trips that will reenforce the concepts we are learning in class. So far this year we went to the Pacific Airshow. Students learned about the engineering of flight and military planes. It was a fun experience for the students. I have planned a field trip to Sofi Stadium on December 2nd. This field trip was the highlight of my students year last year. They learn about the engineering of the stadium, they get to go in the Chargers and Rams locker rooms and they we able to kick field goals on the field. Currently the cost for busing is \$2000 for my 64 students. The cost of the Sofi Stadium tour is \$35. That put the price of the field trip at \$105.

1. October Minutes – Frizzelle – Wallace motions approval, Bob 2nd. Passed 10-0 (Barbara & Kim abstained)
2. October Financials– Iovine – Update on financials, CD rolled over to 3.1%, working on event totals. Summary = July through Oct \$4,000 of income. Larry motions approval, Bob 2nd. Passed 11-0. 2025-2026 Budget Review. Barbara proposes increasing corporate contributions to \$5,000 and increasing marketing to \$2,000. Matt suggests that the current marketing budget is for existing events, as events are added, the marketing needs to be built into the event. 5. Trackless Train Rental for 12/6 Tree Lighting - \$1,800 – Taylor – Larry motions to give ½ (\$900) for train rental, Glenn 2nds, passed 12-0

DIRECTOR UPDATES (3 Minute Reports/Discussion)

- Volunteer Waiver update – Taylor – Waivers are being saved on Google drive, will get more at Tree Lighting.
- Poker Recap – Montz/Grandis 65 sign-ups, 30 walk-ups, 5 no shows. Glenn suggested moving forward, trying to improve participants' signing up in advance. Ideas for incentives, like raffle entry, to encourage people to sign up in advance. More improvements with promotion of the tournament, ie.. social media, next door etc. In the past, the tournament had 200 + players, suggested to go to groups. Food was great, event should start at 5pm not 6pm. There was zero sponsorships for this tournament, reach out to the chamber for more sponsorship opportunities. Volunteers were a great help. \$15,000 made, \$8,000 in buy-backs, expenses \$1,200.
