BYLAW X OFFICERS

1. Officers

The officers of the corporation shall be President, **President Elect or Immediate Past President**, Secretary, and Treasurer and such other officers as the Board of Directors may elect. Those officers shall serve without compensation. All officers except the Secretary shall be members of the Board of Directors. The Board may also elect a Chief Executive Officer who shall manage the day to day activities of the corporation as a salaried employee who shall not be a member of the board or an employee, officer or elected official of the City of Fountain Valley. Any number of offices may be held by the same person, except that neither the Secretary nor the Treasurer may serve concurrently as either the President or the Chairman of the Board.

2. Election of Officers

The officers of the corporation, except those appointed in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of this Article X, shall be chosen by the Board of Directors, and each shall serve at the pleasure of the Board. **Terms of office for Secretary and Treasurer are two years. The term for the President will last four years as the President will serve as the President Elect, President, and Immediate Past President.**

Background:

- Treasurer / Financial Oversight

Responsibilities of Co-Chairs May Include:

- Planning and oversight of assigned area or event
- Coordination with staff, volunteers, and committees

- Board Members may serve in more than one area if appropriate

Briefly state what makes your Program unique.

Our program is unique because it is the only program in our district of 6 high schools that is increasing in size and continually expanding as a music program. Additionally, our music program extends itself as ambassadors in music for our high school and local community. We fulfill our mission and serve our purpose by honoring our armed forces and those who have sacrificed for the betterment of our society, celebrating accomplishments and commemorations, and mourning sacrifices. Our students learn multiple styles of music and are provided a music education that will prepare them for further musical studies beyond high school so that they are prepared for their futures.

The Concert Band has grown from 48 students to 65 students over the past 2 years.

The Orchestra program has grown from 39 students to 70 students over the past 5 years.

Our marching band grew from 62 students to 78 students in 1 year and is expected to grow to 90+ in the next year.

Our indoor percussion ensemble grew from 16 students to 28 students this past year.

We participate in many key events for our community, including attributing over 130 participants in the Hyundai 5k run in September, representing Fountain Valley in national level parades and performances such as the Pearl Harbor Memorial Parade in Hawaii, the Memorial Day Parade in Washington DC, performances in internationally recognized concert halls such as the Segerstrom Center for the Arts performance hall, the Samueli Hall, Sonoma's Green Music Center, and the Carpenter Performing Arts Center in Long Beach. We also focus on honoring and paying respect to our local community, performing in the Tet festival at Costa Mesa fairgrounds, the Tet parade in Westminster, and other local events such as

Future performances include venues such as Carnegie Hall in New York, parades in London, concert halls in Prague, and different major hubs in the United States such as Seattle, Chicago, and other locations.

Briefly describe the Organization's Key Initiatives, Accomplishments and/or Challenges over the Past Two Years.

As a music program, our mission is to provide our students with an exceptional musical and cultural experience, promoting and fostering teamwork, self-discipline, and leadership while demonstrating artistic excellence in representation of our program to create an everlasting legacy. This experience includes performing with passion, learning with purpose, and connecting with diverse communities, and building lifelong friendships & memories for every member of our music program.

Some challenges included student participation, but it has been improving and more students are in the ensemble. Quality of instruments and equipment have always been a challenge and we have been focused on replacing or adding new instruments. Our cello section grew from 9 students to 16 students and we do not have enough cellos for the students to play on.

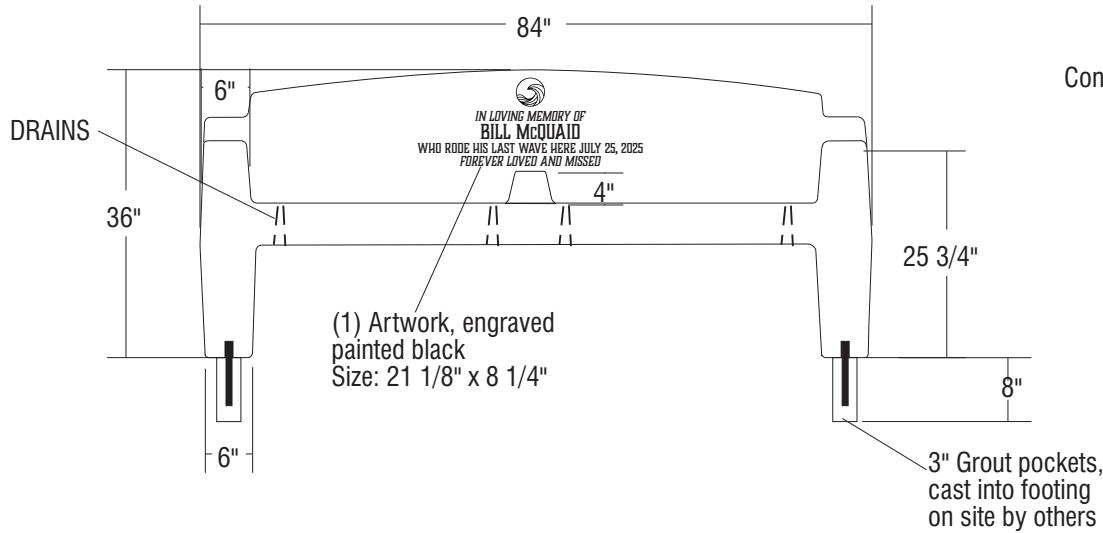

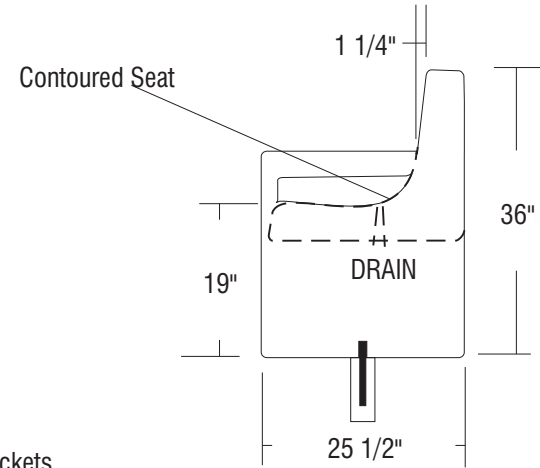

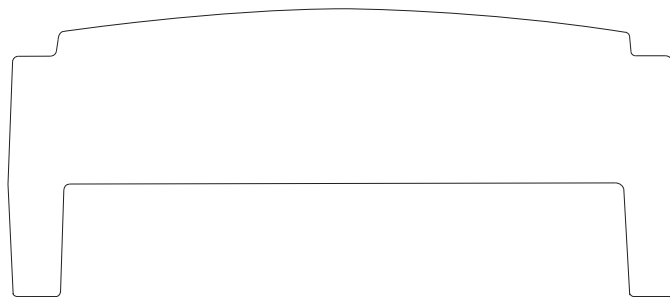
FRONT ELEVATION

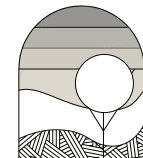
1. Concrete mix design to include a mixture of Portland Cement, water, coarse and fine aggregates, pure mineral oxide coloring agents (when applicable) to yield a minimum compressive strength of 5000 psi.
2. Final product shall be reinforced with #4 and #5 rebar grid.
3. Product is cast in 1-piece with no assembly required.
4. Hairline cracks may develop over time. These are not structural failures, but inherent characteristics of the material itself.
5. Air pockets are a common occurrence in precast products. The frequency and size of air pockets are variable and to be expected, especially on vertical surfaces.
6. Concrete corners and edges will chip if not handled according to guidelines. Patch kits are available but may or may not blend and can be variable.
7. There is a level of care and maintenance associated with your product and is the responsibility of the end user. Choosing the right sealer can help minimize those costs.

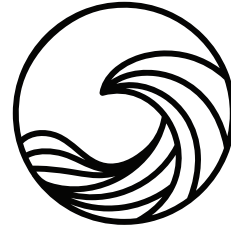
This bench model will have cast in threaded inserts in the bottom of each leg. Bench will be supplied with coilrod for mechanical attachment, as an additional security method.
 **Bench requires epoxy applied to cover bottom of entire leg. Epoxy adhesive should be checked periodically to ensure continued adhesion.

- *Threaded inserts in legs for mounting dowels (1 per leg).
- (2) 3/4" x 8" coilrods provided per bench for mounting.

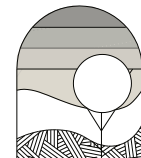

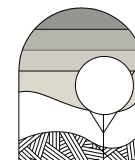
INSTRUCTIONS FOR BENCH INSTALLATION WITH COILROD

****Most bench models will have threaded inserts in bottom of each leg and coilrod will be supplied. Please reference the spec sheet of the model of bench being purchased for additional information.***

- 1) Pour a concrete footing with 3" diameter grout pockets, per spec sheet. Make sure it is flat and level.
- 2) While bench is lifted, thread coilrod (shipped with bench), into threaded inserts in bottom of bench.
- 3) Place bench with coilrods into grout pockets in footing. Do not epoxy yet as a "dry run" to check for proper fit is recommended.
- 4) If bench installs properly then you can proceed to permanent installation that includes application of mortar/epoxy (not supplied by ODC).
- 5) Remove bench with coilrods. Mix mortar and fill grout pockets $\frac{3}{4}$ full with mortar.
- 6) Apply a thick bead of construction epoxy on the bottom of each leg.
- 7) Reinstall bench with coilrods into grout pockets located in footing.
- 8) Use rags/towels to clean up any epoxy that may squeeze out from under the bench as it settles on footing.
- 9) Epoxy adhesive should be checked periodically to ensure continued adhesion.

****The concrete footing/flatwork is the minimum below grade requirement as recommended by Outdoor Creations, Inc. Any additional requirement such as additional height, inset mounting pocket, changes to mounting method for local code requirements, etc. to be the responsibility of the customer.
