Briefly state what makes your Program unique.

Los Amigos High School's aquatics program is one of the most storied and inclusive in the Garden Grove Unified School District. With a history dating back to the school's founding in 1968, our program has cultivated generations of student-athletes who compete at the highest local and regional levels. What truly sets us apart is our commitment to serving every student — from CIF-contending varsity athletes to Moderate-Severe Special Education students participating in Unified PE competitions. This combination of excellence and inclusive programming reflects the heart of our school community and makes our aquatics facility a vital asset for all 129 student-athletes and beyond.

Briefly describe the Organization's Key Initiatives, Accomplishments and/or Challenges over the Past Two Years.

Los Amigos High School's aquatics program has a proud and decorated history, and recent years have continued that tradition of excellence. In 2025, our girls' swim team captured their first-ever league championship — a landmark milestone for the program. Our boys' swim program has now accumulated 9 league titles, demonstrating decades of sustained competitive success. Our water polo programs remain active contenders in the Garden Grove League, building on a legacy that includes a 1992 CIF-SS Division IV Boys' Championship and a 2018 CIF Southern Section Division 7 Girls' Finals appearance.

Beyond competition, we have expanded our commitment to inclusive athletics through our Unified PE program, which provides Moderate-Severe Special Education students the opportunity to train and compete in an aquatics setting alongside their peers — an initiative that speaks to the broader mission of Los Amigos High School.

Our primary current challenge is the condition of our aquatics facility. The windscreens surrounding the pool are torn and deteriorating, detracting from the safety, functionality, and appearance of a space that has served our community for over five decades. This grant would allow us to restore and elevate that facility — ensuring it reflects the quality and pride of the program it has long supported.

Briefly describe the Project for which funding is sought.

Los Amigos High School is seeking funding to replace the deteriorating windscreens surrounding our on-campus aquatics facility. The current windscreens are torn, faded, and well past their useful life — compromising both the functionality and appearance of a facility that has served our school and community since 1968.

The replacement windscreens will be custom-fitted, high-quality, and branded with the Los Amigos Lobos logo, transforming the look and feel of our pool area. Beyond aesthetics, the new screens will reduce wind interference across the water's surface, creating safer and more consistent conditions for student-athletes during practice and competition. They will also provide enhanced privacy and minimize distractions, allowing our 129 student-athletes — including participants in our inclusive Unified PE program — to train and compete in a focused, professional environment.

This is a one-time capital improvement with lasting impact. The upgraded facility will elevate the experience for students, coaches, families, and visiting teams, and will serve as a source of pride for the Los Amigos community for years to come. At a total project cost of \$4,800, this represents a high-impact, cost-effective investment in the students and athletic legacy of Los Amigos High School.

What is expected to be achieved?

The replacement of our aquatics facility windscreens is expected to deliver meaningful improvements across several areas:

- Safety & functionality: New windscreens will reduce wind interference across the water's surface, creating safer and more consistent conditions for student-athletes during both practice and competition.
- Privacy & focus: Proper screening minimizes outside distractions, allowing our 129 student-athletes to train and compete in a focused, professional environment.
- School pride & identity: Custom screens branded with the Los Amigos Lobos logo will foster school spirit and create a more welcoming, polished atmosphere for students, families, and visiting teams.
- Inclusivity: An improved facility directly benefits our Unified PE participants — Moderate-Severe Special Education students who deserve to train and compete in a space that reflects their dignity and effort.
- Community image: As a facility that hosts Garden Grove League meets and community-facing events, an upgraded pool area reflects positively on Fountain Valley as a whole.
- Long-term value: High-quality replacement screens will require minimal maintenance and are expected to outlast the current deteriorating ones significantly, making this a sound, one-time investment with lasting returns.

This project will directly serve the 129 student-athletes currently enrolled in the Los Amigos High School aquatics program, spanning competitive swim, water polo, and our Unified PE program for Moderate-Severe Special Education students. The facility also serves the broader school population through physical education classes, as well as coaching staff, families, and community members who attend meets and events throughout the year. Los Amigos High School is located within Fountain Valley and serves a diverse student population from across the surrounding community. Approximately 30% of our aquatics participants are Fountain Valley residents, representing direct, meaningful impact on the Foundation's primary constituency.

The Vietnamese Soccer Association of Southern California (VSASOCAL) is a community-based nonprofit organization dedicated to promoting youth development, cultural connection, and community well-being through sports, education, and creative expression.

Our work is built on four core pillars:

- Youth development through sport and education
- Preservation of cultural heritage
- Cross-cultural connection through community events
- Health, teamwork, leadership, and resilience

Soccer is a central tool we use to engage youth, strengthen families, and build inclusive community spaces.

Over the past two years, VSASOCAL has successfully planned and delivered large-scale community programs serving thousands of residents across Fountain Valley and surrounding cities.

Youth Soccer & Sports Programming:

- Facilitated weekly practices, organized live games, and hosted soccer tournaments serving 400+ participants across all age groups
- Established a strong volunteer base and community partnerships to support youth athletics
- Community Kid Soccer Academy
- Served children ages 8–12 at Mile Square Park
- Offered skill-building, strength training, teamwork, and discipline
- Program operated weekly (Fridays, 5:00–7:00 PM)
